

LESSON PLAN: COLORS

OBJECTIVES:

- Introduction to primary colors: Red, Yellow, Blue
- To visually differentiate between primary colors.

MATERIALS:

- Red, yellow and blue papers,
- At least two other things for each color.

LESSON PLAN:

In this lesson plan we are going to introduce children to primary colors. Colors are everywhere around us, so it is quite possible that children might know these name or might be confused between their names. To make this association between sight of color and its name easier, we are going to introduce it with number of activities. First one being a fun color song! Before starting with the song, make sure the all the materials are ready. The colored papers, keep it handy- show it to them while you are singing a song. And the other colored objects, keep it in different spots in the room.

ACTIVITY 1: THE FUN COLOR SONG

Instruct them to pay attention and to look at the color. Tell them to go and look around for that color object when they hear "Can you find?"

Ready, set and here it goes:

Tune: "I hear thunder"

I am blue color, I am blue color
look at me, look at me,
Look around and search for me
Look around and search for me
Can you find? can you find?



Similarly, sing for yellow and red as well. Once that is done, last paragraph of the song will be:

"We are primary colors (x2)

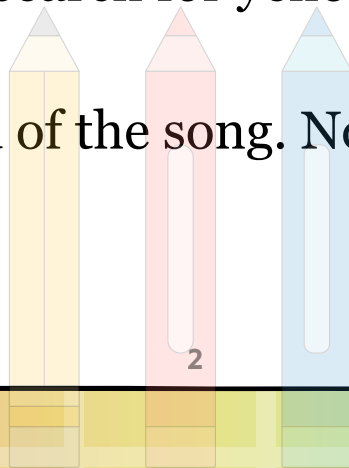
red, blue, yellow (x2)

Look around and search for red,

Look around and search for blue

Look around and search for yellow.

And that's the end of the song. Now, to recap its time for activity 2.

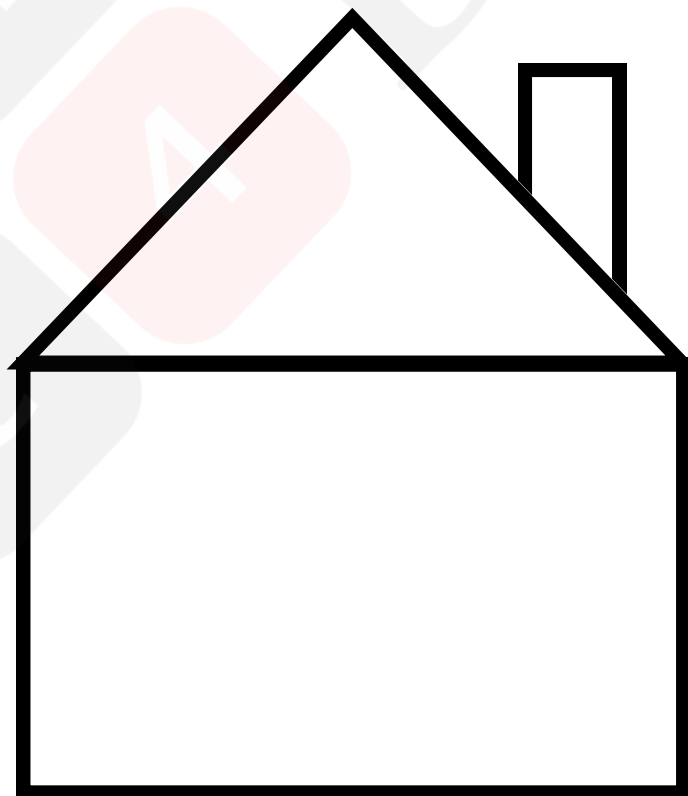


ACTIVITY 2: SEGREGATION

Start by gathering all the red, blue and yellow objects that you had placed in the room (you can involve the children in collecting). For the next step either place 3 baskets/box to put the segregate and put objects of each color or just assign 3 different places and label it as red, yellow and blue respectively.

ACTIVITY 3: COLOR THE HOUSE

Lastly to check whether they correctly associated the names, ask them to color this house (on the next page) specific colors. For example: the roof with red, chimney with blue and house with yellow.



Some other fun activities to do are to search for these colors things in nature and surrounding for example: flower, bird. sky, vehicles, sun, etc.

Another interesting game to play is: Make a dice (or use flashcards) with this 3 colors. Roll the dice whichever color shows up, they have to find that color object! Here is a bonus worksheet to do:
