

RHYMING WORDS

OBJECTIVES:

- To introduce children to rhyming words.
- To be able to identify rhyming words

LESSON PLAN:

Firstly write down these pair of words on a paper or board:

pan- fan lip-ear flow-glow year-hear look-book
bed-eye gun-fun nose-hose tree- ring play-tray

Ask the children to read the words out loud. Then, specifically ask for the ending sounds of words of each pair. As they read each pair, lead the question- is the ending sound of both the words same? Repeat the same for all the pairs. Great job! There is a special term for the words having the same sound at the end- rhyming words.

Yes! the words that have similar or same ending sounds are called as RHYMING WORDS.

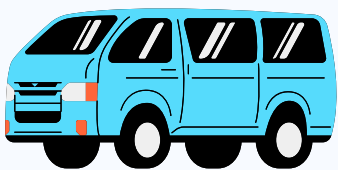
Now, let us look at some more rhyming words:

cat - bat- sat - fat - pat
pot - bot - cot - dot - got
pin - fin - tin - bin - win
ban - can - fan - tan - van
joke - woke - poke - yoke
hole - role - sole - pole

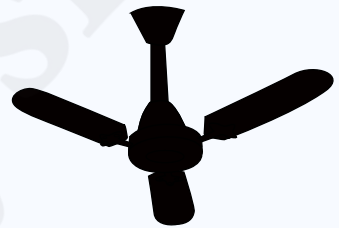
ACTIVITY 1: Match the Pictures that Rhymes
